The [Atlanta Regional Commission Complete Count Committee](#) is an internal team of about 12 people who meet regularly to discuss agency-wide opportunities to disseminate materials and get the word out about the importance of obtaining a full Census count in the Atlanta region. The Atlanta Regional Commission, the regional planning and intergovernmental coordination agency for the 10-county area including Cherokee, Clayton, Cobb, DeKalb, Douglas, Fayette, Fulton, Gwinnett, Henry and Rockdale counties, as well as the City of Atlanta, has a representative on the Governor's Complete Count Committee, as well as staff members who work with traditionally hard-to-count populations.
